## Literary Analysis: Antithesis

Antithesis is a figure of speech characterized by strongly contrasting words, phrases, sentences, or ideas. An example of antithesis is by the light of day and by the dark of night. A writer or speaker uses this technique of balancing one element against another to create

emphasis. In the above example, the juxtaposition of <i>light of day</i> with <i>dark of night</i> emphasizes the speaker's reference to all times—day and night.
